- Launch of all 2500 NSKs (NRC Seva Kendras) in all districts, each NSK loaded with computerised version of all available data of 1951 NRC and Electoral Rolls up to 24th March (Midnight), 1971 for the ENTIRE STATE
- Publication of printed copies of all available data of 1951 NRC and Electoral Rolls up to 24th March (Midnight), 1971 at NSKs and Polling Stations
- Launch of online computerised version of all available data of 1951 NRC and Electoral Rolls up to 24th March (Midnight), 1971

Verification Phase

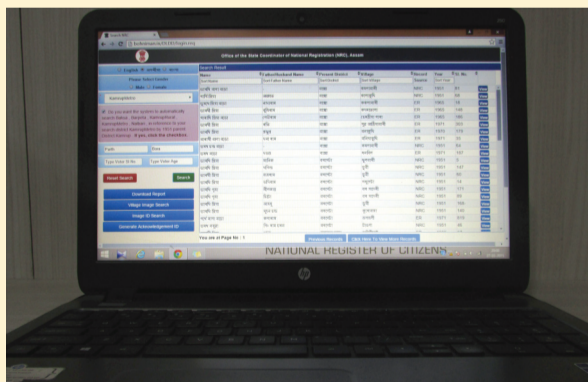
Draft NRC Publication and Receipt of Claims & Objections Phase

With the launch of all 2500 NSKs (NRC Seva Kendras), the first phase, namely, **Legacy Data Publication Phase** has formally started. Data of NRC, 1951 and all the Electoral Rolls published before 24th March (Midnight), 1971 (as available) – also called **Legacy Data** - will now be available in all these NSKs, on the web (nrcassam.nic.in) and at Polling Stations in your vicinity. WHY IS PUBLIC REQUIRED TO SEARCH FOR LEGACY DATA?

Linkage with persons (ancestors) appearing in the Legacy Data shall be one of the most common methods for establishing eligibility for inclusion in updated NRC. Details of this linkage will be required to be quoted while submitting application for inclusion in updated NRC. To enable search by public, printed Legacy Data has been published at the NSKs and Polling Stations and its computerized version at all the NSKs and also online. **Now, the public is required to search for names of their ancestors in the Legacy Data.**



WHAT ARE THE TIMELINES FOR SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FORM?

Application Forms will be made available to the public in last week of April, 2015 and will be required to be submitted within July, 2015. Elaborate advertisement campaign and instructions on Application Form submission would be issued separately.

LEGACY DATA SEARCH AND ISSUE OF LEGACY DATA CODE AT NSKs OR ONLINE ARE COMPLETELY FREE OF COST

LEGACY DATA OF ANY YEAR UP TO 24TH MARCH (MIDNIGHT) 1971 WILL ALLOW ELIGIBILITY FOR INCLUSION IN UPDATED NRC.

FOR NAMES WRONGLY SPELT IN LEGACY DATA, VERIFICATION WOULD BE DONE THROUGH RECORDING OF APPROPRIATE EVIDENCE. AFFIDAVITS CAN BE SUBMITTED, WHICH, HOWEVER, WOULD BE ACCEPTED SUBJECT TO VERIFICATION.

LEGACY DATA CODE

To enable easy quoting of ancestral linkage by citizens while applying for inclusion in updated NRC, a system of **Legacy Data Code** has been developed. **Legacy Data Code** consists of an 11 digit number in the format xxx-xxxx-xxxx assigned against each name in the Legacy Data. Wherever the name of the ancestor is found, a Legacy Data Slip containing the **Legacy Data Code** shall be printed and issued to the applicant. This **Legacy Data Code** shall be required to be quoted by the applicant in the Application Form at the time of submission. Application submission process will start in the last week of April, 2015. Search and issue of a valid **Legacy Data Code** can be done through any of the following :

- At the NSK** - through computerised or manual search (of available printed copies).
- Online** (nrcassam.nic.in) - for computerised search.
- At the Polling station** - by manual search of printed copies and thereafter issue of a valid **Legacy Data Code** at the nearest NSK.

Certified copies/extracts of Legacy Data wherever available with citizens would be cross checked with the Legacy Data available with Govt. for issue of valid **Legacy Data Code**. In such cases, citizens would have to go to the nearest NSK or Web along with their existing certified copy for its on the spot validation and issue of a valid **Legacy Data Code**. In case on the spot validation does not happen, details of the certified copy would be received for further checking with all available records of the issuing authority.

It may, however, be noted that computerized Legacy Data search is just a tool to facilitate easy search, and by no means the only resort for finding proof for eligibility in updated NRC. Even if one does not find the required name in the computerised or printed Legacy Data, application can still be made for inclusion in NRC by providing any one of the other admissible documents issued before 24th March, 1971 (Midnight), namely, (i) Land & Tenancy records (ii) Citizenship Certificate (iii) Permanent Residence Certificate (iv) Refugee Registration Certificate (v) Passport (vi) LIC Policy (vii) Govt. issued License/Certificate (viii) Govt. Service/ Employment Certificate (ix) Bank/Post Office Accounts (x) Birth Certificate (xi) Board/University Educational Certificate (xii) Court Records/ Processes (xiii) Certificate issued by GP Secretary countersigned by Local Revenue Officials in respect of females who have migrated to another village after marriage / certificate issued by Circle Officer in respect of females who have migrated from an urban area after marriage, and (xiv) Ration Cards issued up to 24th March (Midnight), 1971*.

*SI No. (xiii) and (xiv) are only supporting documents.

It may be noted that names of only those persons would ordinarily be available in the Legacy Data who would have been at least 21 years of age in 1971, meaning thereby that they would have been born around 1950-51 or before.
